**Course Catalog Description:** The University of California-wide goals of the Carbon Neutrality Initiative are introduced through a series of modules where students learn basic principles of carbon neutrality, participate in seminars with campus operations staff, and tour relevant campus infrastructure including the UC San Diego microgrid, Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certified buildings, and sustainable transportation efforts. **Prerequisites:** upper-division standing.

## **Course Objectives**

- 1. Understand societal and technical changes required for a low carbon future
- Assess the robustness of climate action plans and place them in a broader context
- 3. View your own environment through a climate lens to identify challenges and opportunities for change
- 4. Evaluate your own role in climate action

### **Course Structure**

There will be a pre-class assignment every week. The assignments are meant to help you reflect on the previous class and prepare you for the next class. The questions will often be discussed in class, either with other students or as a class. The first hour of each class will usually consist of a short lecture and several group discussions. The second hour of class will usually consist of a guest presentation. When possible, the readings and class discussion will reflect the background/content of the guest speaker presentation. You are expected to come to every class period prepared with thoughts to contribute to the discussion. Questions are always welcomed and encouraged.
