**Course structure and Grading:** ESYS 187A & B is a two-quarter class sequence that is offered as P/NP. This course is predominantly an independent student internship with a one hour/week seminar component. Your grade is based on the successful completion of your internship hours, class attendance, and assignments (see below). At the end of Fall Quarter, you will receive an 'In Progress' grade, and you will receive a P/NP grade at the end of Winter Quarter. Since ESYS187A is a P/NP course, assignments will be graded as complete or incomplete, with written feedback, rather than a numeric or letter grade.

**Seminar Objectives:** The goals of the one-hour seminar component of ESYS187A are to:

- Clarify and provide information on the internship requirements
- Build skills and management tools to define project goals and timelines
- Ensure progress on the project goals
- Address any issues or problems that arise – both as a group and individually
- Host guest speakers and offer useful workshops
- Develop a supportive ESYS student community
